


Official News from the Association will be published in each issue of the magazine. Reports of major actions undertaken by the Association and announcement of services to members will be found in this section of the magazine.

Total Freedom Event

Recently an event was held at Flag* in celebration of the legal win in Portland. This major advance in guaranteeing the future of Scientology religion has largely been due to the work and assistance of members of the International Association of Scientologists.

Senior Scientologists spoke to the public gathered at Flag AND to the thousands of other Scientologists in Boston, New York, Toronto, Los Angeles. Portland, and San Francisco who viewed this event via satellite relay.



Major Association Accomplishments

Membership in the Association is increasing by nearly 1,000 members per month due to the work of many dedicated members. However there are still thousands of Scientologists who still need to be signed up and the assistance of every member is needed to reach the goal of 200,000 members.

Since its formation in October 1985, the Association has sponsored over 30 events around the world to brief Scientologists on the Association and Association activities.

Major legal gains are being made in court cases around the world as the result of actions being taken by Association members. Further information on two major wins are on page 19 of this issue.

A music cassette called "The Battle of Portland" has been produced by Association members Jon Batson and the Peter Schless Band.

The Association assisted in getting this cassette produced and it is now available to Scientologists around the world.

The Association now has members in 35 countries around the world — including Ghana, Pakistan and Saudi Arabia.

Celebrity Scientologists and Association Members Amanda Ambrose and Michael Roberts have been very active as Field Staff Members for the Ship Donation Project. Recently Amanda and friends gave a benefit concert at Flag for the Ship Donation Project which was a success.

During the concert Amanda said, "We need this ship and it is our responsibility to make it happen." She said with a smile, "I'm also regging non-Scientologists!" It IS our responsibility as members to help secure a safe space for the delivery of New OT VIII and IX. All members can help through their own donations, by informing their fellow Scientologists of the vital necessity for the ship, by alerting the Ship Project to people who might want to be crew members or by joining vourself.
